excellence in public health.		<b>Undergraduate Students:</b> To tailor the student section's activities and initiatives to the preferences of its members, a survey was administered to gauge the preferred engagement/leadership model for both graduate and undergraduate students. The survey aimed to gather feedback on various aspects, such as the types of activities, events, and initiatives that would most effectively engage students in public health. The survey proposed 4 types of leadership models including: 1) Student section will meet to discuss topics pertinent to state or national public health or student-related issues. It will also function as a platform for networking amongst public



<ul> <li>health students. 2) Appointed student delegates who are members of other member sections will represent each section. Delegate reports of discussion in respective member sections will be given by appointed delegates at student section meetings quarterly. 3) Student section will solely work toward a yearly project such as the Public Health Week (April 3-9, 2023) to promote partnership between colleges and public health on university campuses.</li> <li>4) I do not prefer a separate student section. All students will join other NDPHA member sections as members. The majority of student responses indicated a preference for Model 2, which included appointed delegates that will be used to guide future planning. The majority of students also voted that they were primarily looking for education and information followed by student networking, interdisciplinary discussion, and social/community work from the NDPHA student section.</li> </ul>
Week: Although we were not able to collaborate Public Health Week on April 3-9, 2023, among universities, it was observed individually by



	organizing a range of activities to raise awareness about public health and its significance within the community.
	Creation of an Instagram Page for the North Dakota Public Health Association: To strengthen communication channels and engage a broader audience, the North Dakota Public Health Association successfully established an Instagram page dedicated to sharing updates on policies, education, and public health advocacy. This platform was strategically chosen to reach a younger demographic and provide easily accessible information on public health topics. The student section actively curated content and maintained regular story updates that encompassed informative posts, news highlights, and educational materials. The NDPHA Instagram account currently has 90 followers. The Instagram page served as an
	effective tool for increasing visibility, disseminating knowledge, and fostering engagement among followers.
